1-3-11	DISCOVERED - THE LAST TINGIRA Secretary discovers the last crew member of the original HMAS Tingira Dan Bowden is still alive and very healthy.
1-4-11	WEBSITE - tingira.org Website launched with newsletter content, links to other JR websites and a members only section.
1-4-11	TINGIRA MEMBERSHIP FOR ALL Five levels of membership are launched with a special offer of a \$200 Life Membership opportunity. Associate members and friends have also been welcomed for allowing family members to become members of the association.
20-4-11	RINGING HER BELL HMAS Tingira was the ship without a bell, the HMAS Leeuwin Bell is still missing, the association is born by christening their own bell, the TINGIRA Bell. Paton Vice Admiral Russ Crane performs the first ringing of the bell.
20-4-11	FIRST HONORARY LIFE MEMBERS Vice Admiral Russ Crane and Treasure Alan Rodgers are made Honorary Life Members of the association for their efforts with the JR reunion and the establishment of the Tingira Australia Association.



Secretary Mark Lee conducts video interview and presents Dan Bowden with Honorary Life membership as he is taken to a nearby nursing home after a fall at home aged 101.
	TINGIRA OPEN - SYDNEY HARBOUR
30-9-11	Kayak racing on Sydney harbour name their race after Tingira as they start and finish from Lynn park site of the Tingira memorial. Association donates "The Bell" trophy in honour of Tingira Boys who were competitive sportsmen in local sports competitions at Rose Bay in the 1920's and Fremantle in the 60-70's.
	RIP - DAN BOWDEN
1-10-11	Dan Bowen passed away two weeks before a special Tingira dinner was to be held in his honour. Minister for Veteran Affairs with many hundreds of locals and navy men attend Dan's Memorial Service, The last Tingira went in peace.
	TINGIRA MEMORIAL PARK - ROSE BAY
8-10-11	Searching the history of the original Tingira we discover a deep history when the original ship know as the Sobraon was in commission. The Tingira Memorial Park in Rose bay also is now on the radar. Tingira is 100 years old on 25 April 2012, commemoration and celebrations are in planning with Woollahra Council and Rose Bay RSL sub-Branch.






