Memorable Moments

Lost Portraits Tingira Boys 1912 & 1968



In May 1918 the Mitchell Library Trustees embarked upon an ambitious project: to photograph NSW soldiers heading overseas to serve in World War I. Officers of the Australian Imperial Force and Naval Forces were invited to the Crown Bromide Enlargement Company, the Crown Studios, in George Street Sydney to be photographed in person or their families sent photographs to be copied. However, due to a fire at Crown Studios in December 1918 the project was never completed. Mr Mark Blow was the senior photographer and manager of the Sydney studio.

From this project, the Mitchell Library holds over 1,600 touching portraits. Many of the Tingira Boys participated in this project. These images have been restored and represent a small selection gathered by the former Tingira Old Boys Association from the sailors and then passed onto RAN Sea Power as part of their permanent collection. Former HMAS Leeuwin Junior Recruit, John Perryman, a full time employee of the RAN Sea Power Centre, and was instrumental in bringing these images to light this year.

The assertive plan for 2018 offers us all an opportunity to build on the great work of the Executive to date and further develop our Association in terms of membership, form and function.

Interestingly, over the last couple of years, I have noted a growing personal enthusiasm, in many of us, to embrace wholeheartedly our ongoing commitment and responsibility to communicate and participate in the further development of our former JR community. This, voluntary and personally accepted, responsibility is palpable and very powerful. I have had the privilege of attending a number of JR Intake reunions over the past 12 months and at each one the eagerness and passion to renew old mateships and tell some, at times outlandish, stories has been profound. Beyond these well organised reunions, I see more of this contact on our Association Facebook page which continues to bring former JRs together, an important part of our Mission!

Crucial in this endeavour, apart from the positive recollections and story telling, is that we cultivate a community who cares about each other and this ongoing contact is vital in ensuring that we keep a weather eye on our mates and their families. As we all mature this becomes even more important. I've not met a sailor yet who does not enjoy a chat or a story - Call a mate and check on his/her progress when you can! It will not go unnoticed.

It is also important that we acknowledge and thank our Leadership, the Association Executive, for the exceptional work that they do in making all of this possible. From implementing the social media to managing the books and focusing on future events their untiring commitment on our behalf is commendable. Our Executive, volunteers all, does a great job for us all and I want to thank our National President, Lance Kerr, and our entire Executive team and their families, for their dedication commitment and enthusiasm in making this all happen. It is hard work and it requires a commitment and dedication that many are unprepared or unable to make. They do! Well done team – keep up the great work.

As our President has mentioned, 2018 will be a big year for our Association particularly, noting the plans for the Rose Bay Memorial renovation and rededication in November. This is a highly appropriate, exciting and challenging project. If successful, it will provide for a significant, iconic, new permanent black granite clad 80 square metre concrete memorial complemented with a new irrigation system hosting 600 meters of new turf on Tingira Reserve. The project also aims to present the full Clipper and Nautical School Ship Sobraon and HMAS Tingira story with over 60 captioned images, laser engraved into the granite cover. Combined with a new cement walkway path from the roadside to the Rose Bay club entrance area, this will become an iconic landmark in Sydney's Eastern suburbs and deliver a very fitting and poignant place of reflection, commemoration and remembrance for a great many of our current and former members of the Royal Australian Navy well into the future.

This year also marks the culmination of the Anzac Centenary program. The Centenary of Anzac 2014 to 2018 is our most important period of national commemoration. Marking 100 years since our involvement in the First World War, the Anzac Centenary is a time to honour the service and sacrifice of our original ANZACs, and the generations of Australian servicemen and women who have defended our values and freedoms, in wars, conflicts and peace operations. While honouring those who have gone before us is central in this period of reflection, an important legacy which flows from the Anzac Centenary is improved community understanding and awareness of our wartime history, particularly for our younger Australians.

The Anzac Centenary gives families, schools and communities an opportunity to start important conversations that continue long after the national program has concluded, and in doing so ensuring an enduring and unifying legacy for current and future generations.

We can play an important part in strengthening this legacy through our attendance, where possible, at programed commemoration activities such as:

01 May - Commemorative Service of the 75th Anniversary of the Battle of the Atlantic held at the RAN Memorial in Canberra;

06 May - Commemorative Service of the Battle of the Coral Sea held at the Australia USA Memorial in Canberra;

27 July - Commemorative Service of the 65th Anniversary of the Korean War Armistice held at the Australian national Korean War Memorial in Canberra;

16 October - Commemorative Service of the 75th Anniversary of the work on Hell Fire Pass and completion of the Thai Burma Railway held at the Australian Ex-Prisoners of War memorial in Ballarat;

11 November - Commemorative Service of the 100th Anniversary of the First World War Armistice to be held in various locations around Australia and the world.

I encourage as many of you as possible to be part of these ceremonies and others. I look forward to meeting as many of our JR community as possible throughout 2018.

We ask all 'Tingira Boys' to be in Sydney for that weekend if possible we will be flying our flag big time and part of these commemoration events.

I would like to thank all members, sponsors and Tingira committee members for their continued support over the year, especially to the two retiring committee members, David Ruckert and Peter Stephenson, who both served us for from the early years of the association. New committeemen David Rafferty and Darryn Rose, welcome aboard, it's going to be a good term over the next three years!
