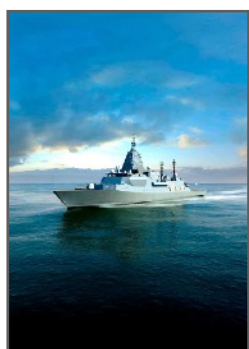

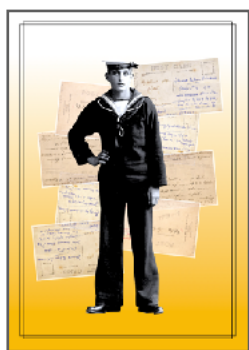

ENHANCED LETHALITY SURFACE COMBATANT FLEET ...



The Albanese Government has released its blueprint for a larger and more lethal surface combatant fleet for the Royal Australian Navy, more than doubling the size of the surface combatant fleet under the former government's plan.

This follows the Government's careful consideration of the recommendations of the independent analysis of the surface combatant fleet, commissioned in response to the Defence Strategic Review.

Our strategic circumstances require a larger and more lethal surface combatant fleet, complemented by a conventionally-armed, nuclear-powered submarine fleet.

" It is demoralising to see six or seven defence ministers cycle through over nine years.

Navy's future fleet will be integral to ensure the safety and security of our sea lines of communication and maritime trade, through operations in our immediate region. This fleet will constitute the largest number of surface combatants since WWII.

The independent analysis of Navy's surface combatant fleet lamented the current surface combatant fleet was the oldest fleet Navy has operated in its history, and emphasised the need for immediate action to boost Navy's air defence, long-range strike, presence and anti-submarine warfare capabilities.

In line with independent analysis' recommendations, Navy's future surface combatant fleet will comprise:

- **26 major surface combatants consisting of:**
- **Three Hobart class air warfare destroyers with upgraded air defence and strike capabilities**
- **Six Hunter class frigates to boost Navy's undersea warfare and strike capabilities**
- **11 new general purpose frigates that will provide maritime and land strike, air defence and escort capabilities**

- **Six new Large Optionally Crewed Surface Vessels (LOSVs) that will significantly increase Navy's long-range strike capacity**
- **Six remaining Anzac class frigates with the two oldest ships to be decommissioned as per their planned service life.**

The Government has also accepted the independent analysis' recommendations to have:

- **25 minor war vessels to contribute to civil maritime security operations, which includes six Offshore Patrol Vessels (OPVs).**

The Hunter class frigates will be built at the Osborne shipyard in South Australia, and will be followed by the replacement of the Hobart class destroyer. The Hobart destroyers will be upgraded at Osborne with the latest US Navy Aegis combat system.

The new general purpose frigate will be accelerated to replace the Anzac class frigates, meaning the Transition Capability Assurance (TransCAP) upgrades are no longer required. These new general purpose frigates will be modern, capable and more lethal, requiring smaller crews than the Anzac.

Consolidation of the Henderson precinct is currently underway, as recommended by the Defence Strategic Review. Successful and timely consolidation will enable eight new general purpose frigates to be built at the Henderson precinct, and will also enable a pathway to build six new Large Optionally Crewed Surface Vessels in Western Australia.

The Albanese Government is committed to continuous naval shipbuilding in Australia and the design of Navy's future fleet will provide a stable and ongoing pipeline of work to the 2040s and beyond.
Budget

In order to implement the recommendations of the independent analysis, the Albanese Government has committed to funding the planned acquisition and sustainment of the future surface fleet.

This will see the Albanese Government inject an additional \$1.7 billion over the Forward Estimates and \$11.1 billion over the next decade in Defence for an accelerated delivery of Navy's future surface combatant fleet and to expand Australia's shipbuilding industry.

This comes on top of the Albanese Government's investment of an additional \$30.5 billion to Defence's Integrated Investment Program out to 2032-33.

This additional \$11.1 billion of funding for the future surface fleet alone brings both acquisition and sustainment investment in the fleet to \$54.2 billion in total over the next decade.

This investment provides a clear pathway for the shipbuilding industry and workforce in South Australia and Western Australia.

The Albanese Government thanks Vice Admiral William Hilarides, USN (Retd), Ms Rosemary Huxtable, AO, PSM and Vice Admiral Stuart Mayer, AO, RAN for their leadership of the independent analysis and contribution to the most comprehensive update to Navy's fleet in decades.

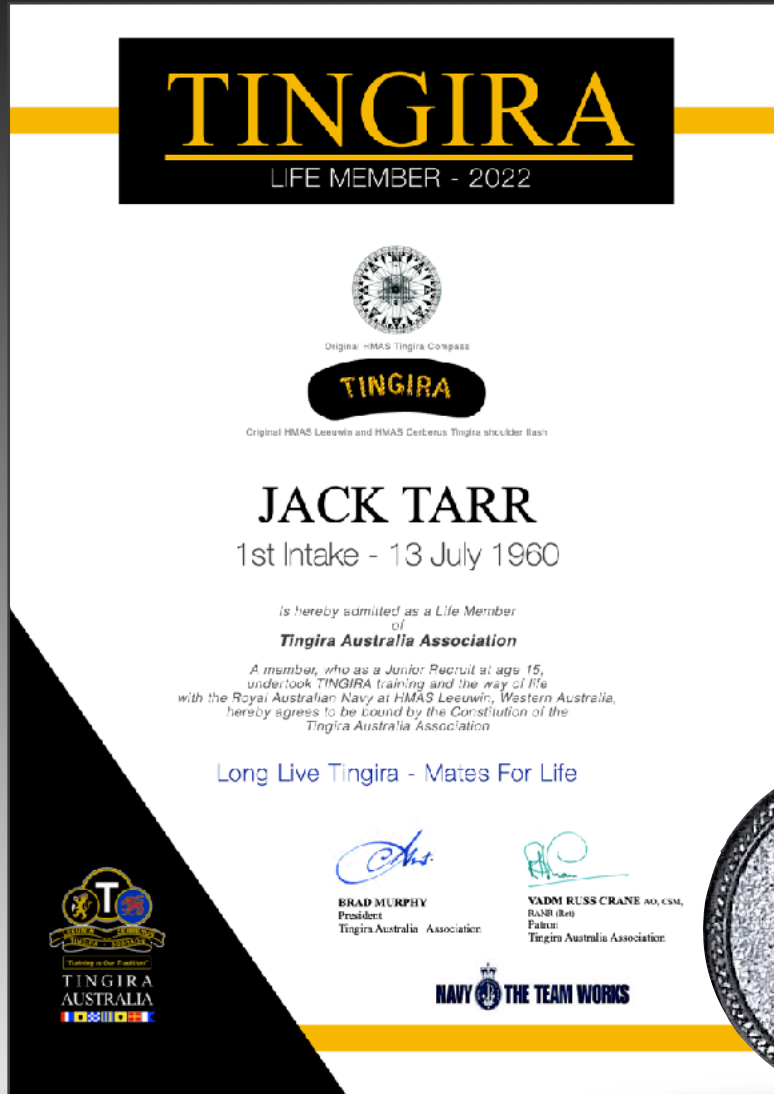

TINGIRA NAMEPLATE

COMPLETES HER VOYAGE ...

The original name plate from the 1912 Royal Australian Navy Training ship HMAS Tingira was recently returned to the RAN. It will be permanently displayed on a wall at the RAN Training School, HMAS Cerberus, Cribb Point, Victoria.

Representing the RAN Chief of Navy, Rear Admiral Steve Tiffen, AM, CSM, RAN, received this prestigious item of naval history from the Secretary of the Tingira Australia Association, Mr. Mark Lee.

Presenting the historic artefact, Mark Lee stated, 'Returning this original name plate back to the navy was always the aim of the Tingira

Association. Back in 2019 we received the nameplate from the NSW Deaf and Blind Association who donated it to the Tingira Association memorabilia collection'.

At the presentation, Rear Admiral Tiffen also received a second item with similar historic value and relevance. This was a copy of a famous print of HMAS Tingira from 1890 in her original status as the English Clipper Ship Sobroan.

Shortly after the 2023 Anzac Day march by the Tingira Boys down Elizabeth Street, Sydney, Mrs Lyn McDougall contacted the Tingira Association saying she was willing to donate her print of Sobroan to the association's Tingira collection. An intriguing element of this donation is the wooden frame. It was made from the

timber deck boards of HMAS Tingira when the ship was broken up in the Sydney shipyards at Berrys Bay in 1941.

Rear Admiral Tiffen said 'This is truly an historic occasion to receive these two items that hold such significant history for the Royal Australian Navy. They will be displayed here at our training facility on the walls of HMAS Cerberus for every sailor to see. When sailors commence their naval careers, a name and ship can mean so much in years to come'.

Commanding Officer of the RAN Recruit School, Commander Ali Withers, was delighted to have these two historic items donated. They will become a major feature on the walls of the sailors recreation centre inside the Recruit School establishment.

The Tingira memorabilia collection is now reaching over 50 items and will soon be distributed between several RAN museums, HMAS STIRLING in Western Australia, HMAS CERBERUS Victoria and HMAS KUTTABUL, Garden Island, NSW.

Captain Alastair Cooper, Director of Sea Power Centre Australia, said, 'it is certainly a welcome gesture by the Tingira Australia association to break up their collection and spread items associated with HMAS Tingira and HMAS Leeuwin, back into our navy museum collections'.

'We see many navy associations take on their namesake collections but sadly, when these associations come to a final close in later years, many of those items just find their way to the local skip bin and that history is lost, forever. Some of those items do make it to our navy museum curators. What is usually missing is the story behind the item, where has it come from and what was its voyage in the pages of our naval history? Without the story, it's very difficult to give the item another life in most situations'.

The boys at Tingira Association have certainly done their homework on their collection items. The navy is very keen to receive these items and place them in their rightful naval museum for future navy members and the general public to see.

1913 the Royal Australian Navy's brand-new fleet sailed through the Heads and into Sydney Harbour. Since then the RAN has served on all the world's oceans in times of peace and war.

During the Second World War, the RAN reached its maximum strength. Approximately 37,000 men and women wore a RAN uniform. The war inflicted a heavy toll on ships and personnel. Thirty-eight cruisers, destroyers, sloops and smaller vessels were sunk and almost 2,200 sailors died on active service.

Since the end of the Second World War, the RAN's fortunes have fluctuated dramatically between lavish acquisitions and slashed defence budgets.

The RAN has sent ships and service personnel to war in Korea, Vietnam and the Persian Gulf. The service has participated in peacekeeping and humanitarian operations all over the globe, at sea, on remote islands and in tri-service deployments. It has played a vital role in protecting our borders and interrupting the international drug trade.

Today the RAN is a highly technical force of state-of-the-art equipment staffed by skilled and dedicated people serving the white ensign in the best traditions of Francis Drake and Horatio Nelson.

To recognise the generations of Australians who have gone to war on great waters the Anzac Memorial will open a year-long exhibition on the Royal Australian Navy on the anniversary of the Battle of Cape Matapan, 27 March 2023.

To be held in Fremantle and Perth, Western Australia, from **Monday 10 to Friday 14 November 2025**, this will be our most historic reunion ever.

It will be proposed for the new incoming Tingira national committee in April to run the event on similar format to the canceled JR Reunion of 2020 which fell victim, like so many other events, to the unprecedented global COVID pandemic.

This will be one of the last occasions that the former Junior Recruits will be able to gather in the Leeuwin establishment in its present status. **Leeuwin Barracks** as it is known today, is presently in use by the Department of Defence. The base is presently under review by the Federal government. In the near future the site is expected to be used again for military requirements or to be re-developed to become part of the local East Fremantle suburban community.

Planning is under way with the RAN and Fremantle local government authorities to conduct a daytime local tribute '**Naval Salute - RAN Junior Recruits**' on Tuesday 11 November 2025,

13,000 15-16 year old boys trained at the HMAS Leeuwin establishment from 1960 to 1984 for the start of their naval careers. This

was part of a great navy tradition following on from the 3,000 'Tingira Boys' who in 1912 also aged 15, trained on board the navy's first training ship, HMAS TINGIRA, anchored in Rose Bay, Sydney, before they too commenced their naval careers, of which many served in both World Wars of 20th century.

Many of the former Junior Recruits that formed the 89 intakes during the period from 1960 to 1984, will unite with intake reunions of their former shipmates over the reunion week. Many will also link up with former sponsors, that were like second parents to them on weekend leave periods during the 12 month training at the HMAS Leeuwin base.

'Sapphire Jubilee' 65th birthday dinner to be held at the Perth Optus Stadium during the five day event. This dinner celebrates the RAN Junior Recruits birthday on the occasion when the first intake of Recruits entered HMAS Leeuwin, 13 July 1960.

Complete details and booking procedures for Tingira Australia members and former RAN Junior Recruits for the '2025 JR Reunion' will be released in May 2024.

Further details will be posted on the Tingira website as they become available during 2024. The Tingira website will be 'live' to take bookings from 1st November 2024".

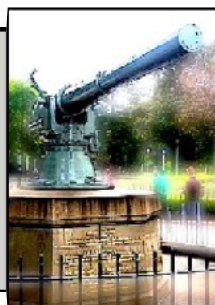

PUBLICATION MARKS

30th ANNIVERSARY REPLICA ENDEAVOUR ...

December 2023, marked 30 years since the Endeavour replica was launched in Fremantle, Western Australia.

To mark this occasion, the Australian National Maritime Museum has developed a new publication that covers the history of two vessels, one successively known as the Earl of Pembroke, HMB Endeavour and finally Lord Sandwich and then an extraordinary replica built over 200 years later.

Endeavour: Encounters, stories and objects of the ship that changed the world is the story of a modest ship, whose scientific, cultural and political legacies span Europe, North and South America, Polynesia, Aotearoa New Zealand and Australia, and still shapes discussions today.

The construction of our replica is itself a remarkable story. Built in Fremantle, a determined, passionate, and dedicated team of craftspeople, boatbuilders, philanthropists and historians re-created the vessel in such detail that it is recognised internationally for the incredible skill in its construction.

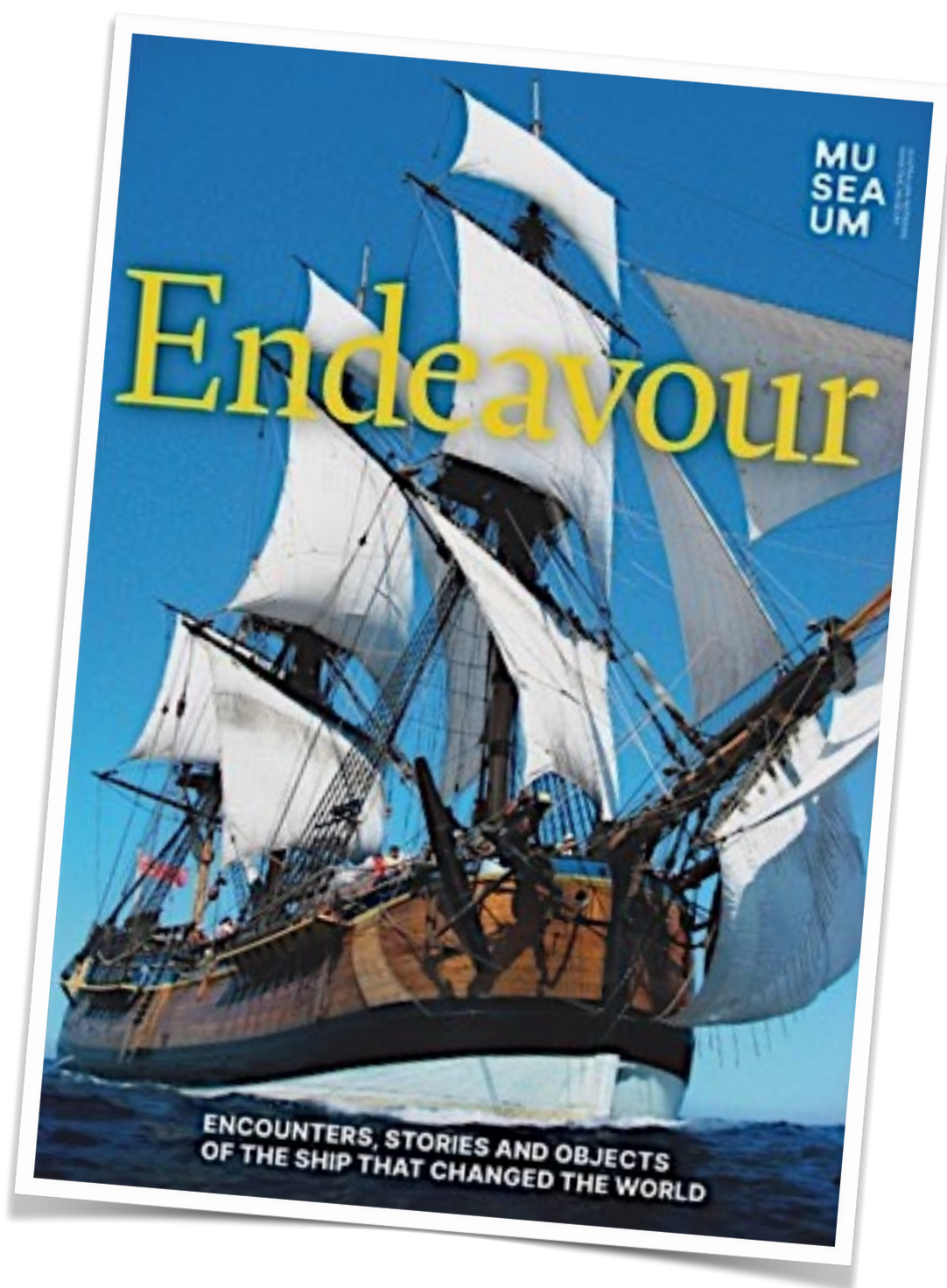
The replica also played a significant role in the identification of the original Endeavour found off Rhode Island, USA. The techniques used to construct the replica mirrored those of the original to such an exact extent that when it came to identifying the wreck off Rhode Island, the 'new' Endeavour proved an invaluable resource.

Endeavour has been the subject of 174 books in the past six decades — including ten books or reports published by the museum— mostly about the ship, James Cook, and botanist on the 1768-1771 voyage, Joseph Banks.

Daryl Karp, Director and CEO of the museum said, 'So much has been written about this most storied of historical ships. But history is neither static nor one-dimensional, and always open to re-interpretation. We hope our new book will add to that knowledge, telling the living story of an amazing vessel both original and replica, here at the Australian National Maritime Museum, the home of the replica since 2005.

'In 2020, in what was the 250th anniversary of Endeavour's arrival in Kamay/ Botany Bay, many opportunities for truth-telling were dulled, or even silenced, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Voices from the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descendants living along the eastern coast of Australia were denied the opportunity to be heard. Fortunately, artworks and interviews by visual artists and community representatives who chose to tell their stories are represented in the collections of the museum. Some are included in this book.

'The 30th anniversary of the replica also provides an opportunity for us to look at the extraordinary skill of Western Australian craftsmen and the vision of so many notable Australians have provided the public with a replica which is renowned around the world for its accuracy and artistry.



‘We wanted to ensure that the story of the replica took its place next to that of the Cook as well as the museum’s search for the resting place of the original – all are combined in this new publication.’

The book includes work by Nigel Erskine, Gemma Cronin, Bill Leonard, Professor John Maynard, Dr Peter Hobbins, Matt

Poll, Anthony Longhurst, Kieran Hosty and Dr James Hunter – all experts in various aspects of the Endeavour story.

All participants undergo an induction and receive appropriate training or instruction to be able to complete their volunteer duties.

Many Tingira descendants are keen to learn of the service of their ancestors and we can now publish a roll of around 3,000 names of those original 'Tingira Boys'.

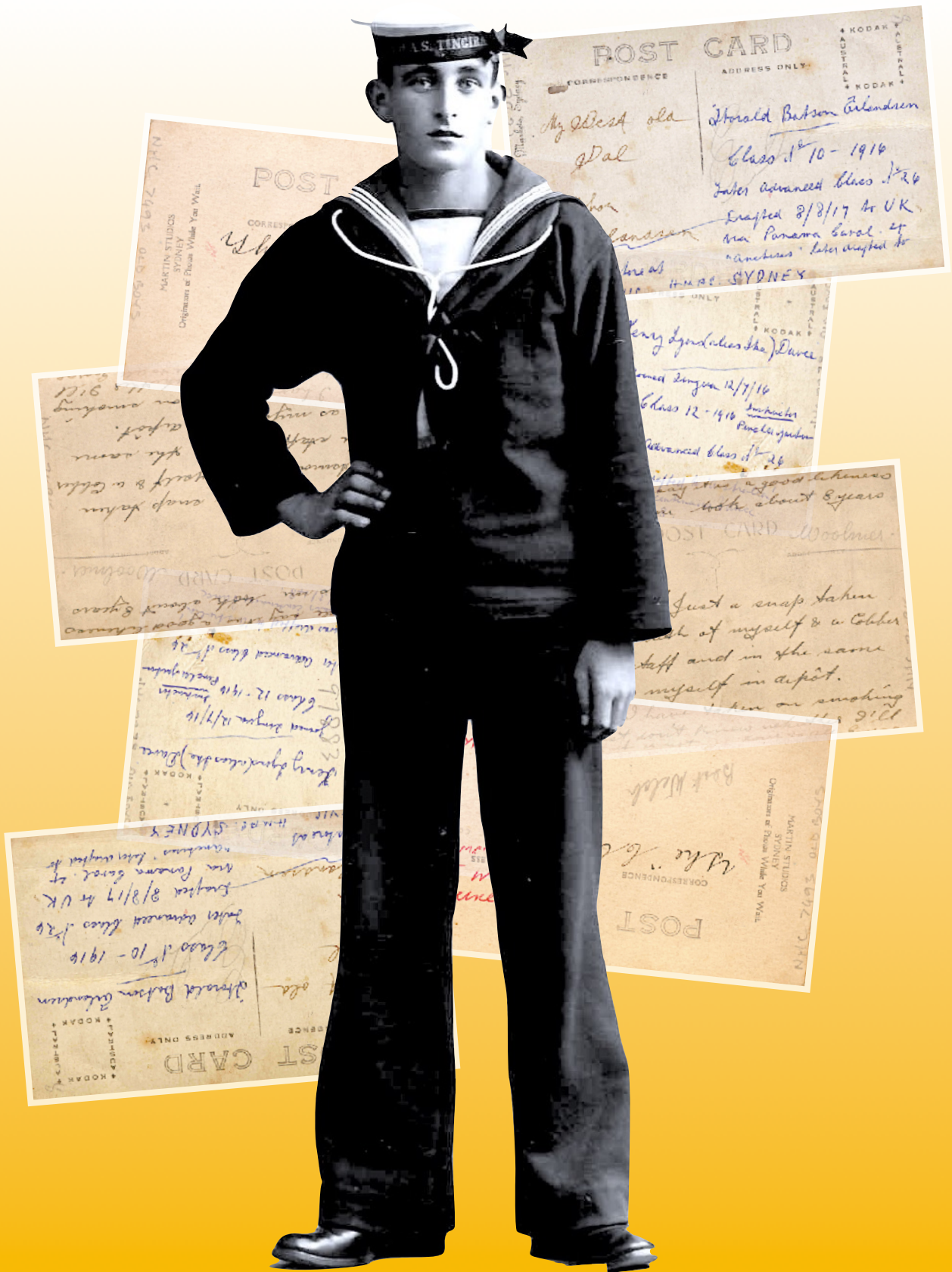
