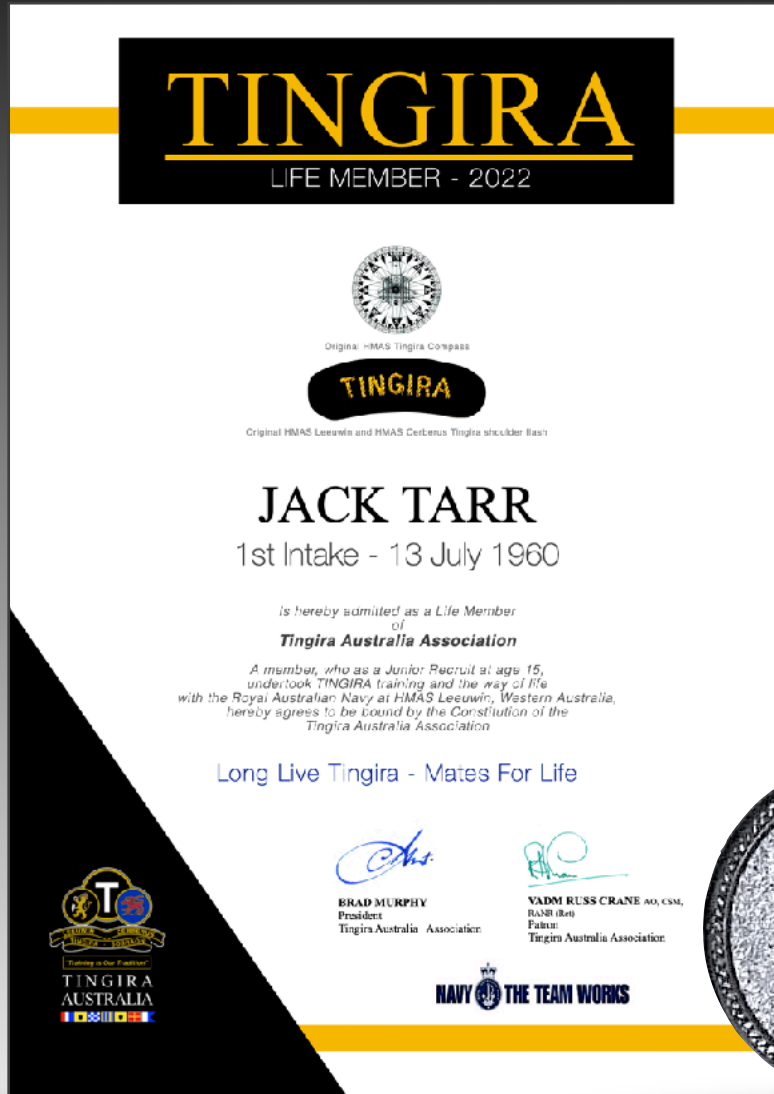

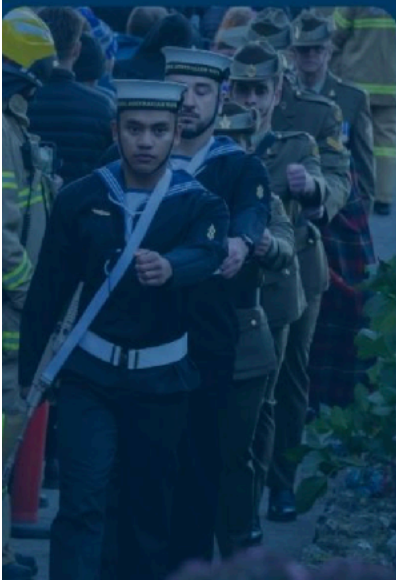

The Traditions of ANZAC Day



A Sprig of Rosemary

Native to the seaside regions of the Mediterranean, rosemary grows wild on the slopes of the **Gallipoli Peninsula**.

Tradition has it that a wounded Digger brought home a small rosemary bush from **ANZAC Cove**, which was planted in the grounds of the Army Hospital at Keswick, South Australia.

Cuttings from this original plant were taken and propagated in nurseries all over Australia, and sprigs of rosemary are **worn to this day** by attendees at **ANZAC Day** ceremonies as a fragrant reminder of the fallen.



The Last Post

The Last Post is traditionally the **bugle call** that signals the end of the working day, but it has been adopted in commemorative services to herald the service people who have gone to their **final rest**.

At Dawn Services, the minute's silence is broken by the **Reveille** – traditionally, the first call of the day to wake sleeping soldiers.



The Ode

Less than two months after WWI was declared, with **heavy casualties** already being reported, English poet Laurence Binyon wrote For the Fallen.

Since 1921, the fourth stanza – known as The Ode – has become a central part of **ANZAC ceremonies...**



Catafalque Party

At the beginning of an ANZAC Day service, four members of the **Defence Force** take up position around the cenotaph or shrine, standing with their heads bowed and arms (the weapons they are carrying) reversed.

They remain there as a **mark of respect** for the fallen until the end of the service. These four sentries are known as a catafalque party.

A catafalque (pronounced cat-a-falk) is a raised platform on which a coffin rests before burial, but is represented at **ANZAC ceremonies** by the memorial.

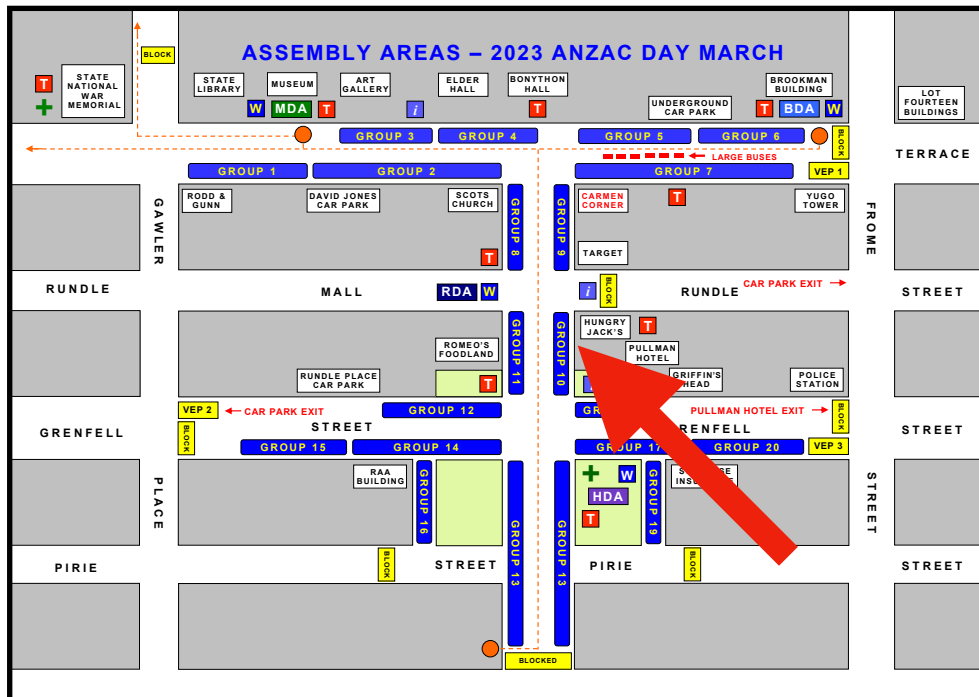

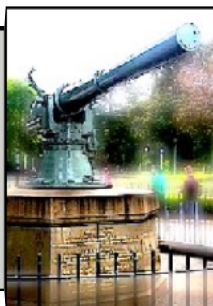

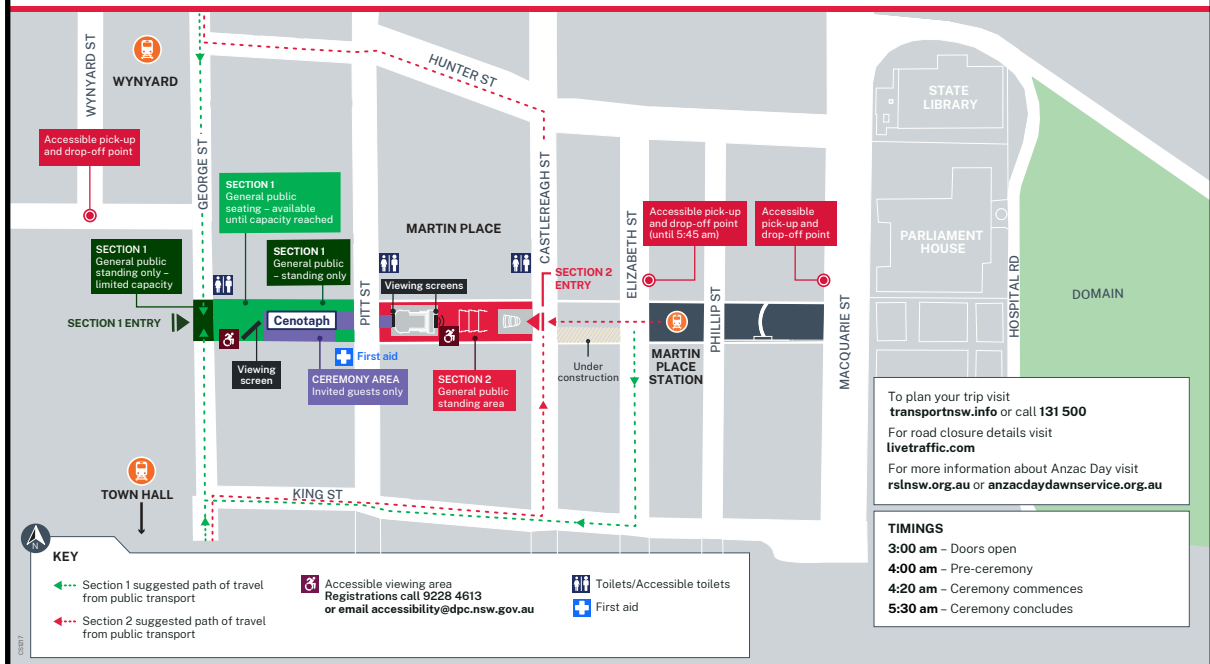

To mark the time at which the first Australians waded ashore ANZAC Cove in 1915, thousands of people will gather at the Cenotaph, Martin Place, Sydney, to watch the official NSW ANZAC Day Dawn Service on 25 April at 4.20 am.

The Dawn Service offers quiet contemplation, accompanied by the bugle call of the Last Post and The Ode of Remembrance.

General public information

General public viewing areas will remain open until capacity is reached, and bag checks will be required upon entry to the site. There are three public viewing areas available:

Section A

1. Martin Place outside Challis House
Seating is available until capacity is reached, once reached standing room will be available until capacity is reached
Entry via George Street
2. Martin Place at George Street
Seating is available until capacity is reached
Entry via George Street

Section B

1. Martin Place between Pitt Street and Castlereagh Street
Standing only
Entry via Castlereagh Street
Please note for the safety of all patrons, bag checks will be conducted on entry. There is no general public entry via Pitt Street.

2024 Sydney ANZAC Day March Map



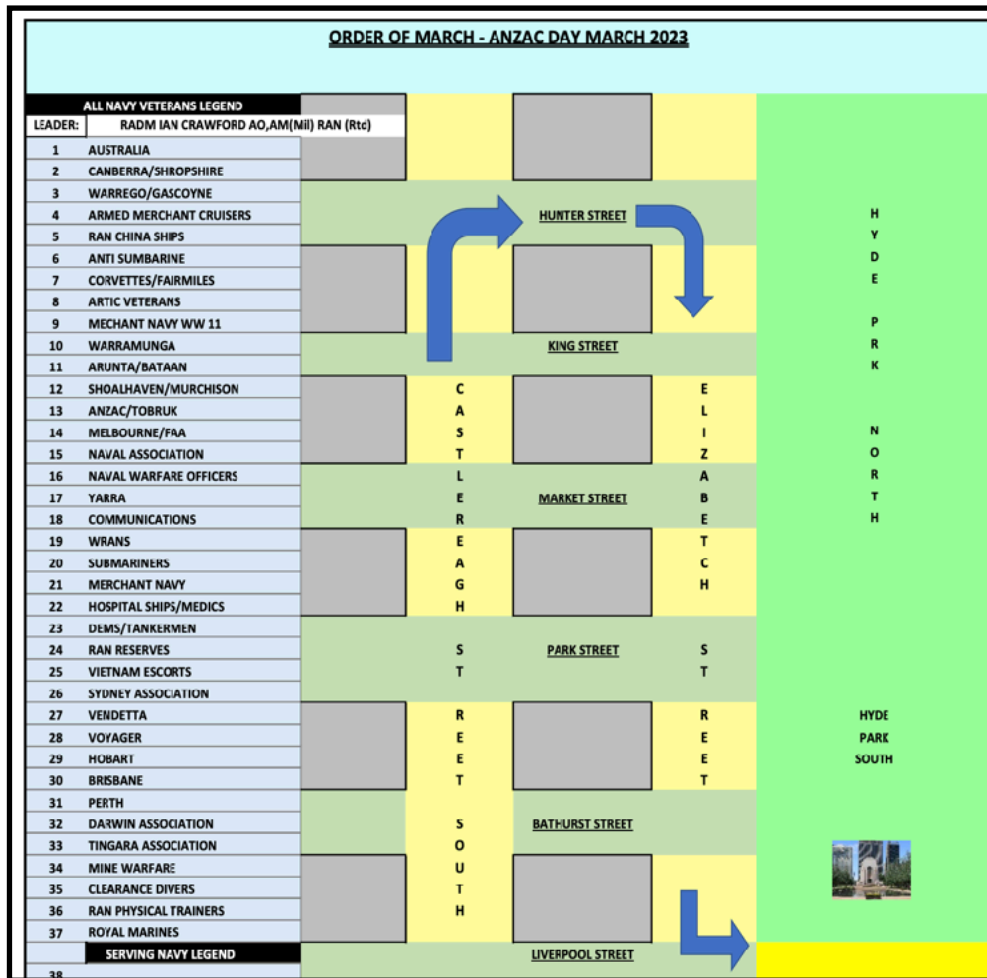

An event like no other, the ANZAC Day March brings the Sydney CBD to a standstill as over 9,000 current serving members and veterans of the Australian Defence Force file past the Anzac Memorial to pay their respects to the fallen.

Spectators are invited to line Elizabeth Street and show their support for the brave men and women who have served their country, and remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice or suffered as a result of their service.

The ANZAC Day March begins at 9am at the intersection of Elizabeth Street and Martin Place, finishing at Liverpool Street at approximately 12.30pm.

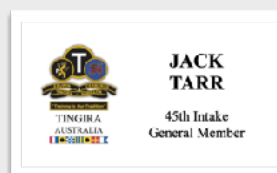
