" Time for Bold and Brave Action "

You are going to hear me in the media over the coming weeks talking about the difference between RSL clubs and RSL NSW – the real RSL. You will hear me calling for the name 'RSL' to be returned, and for a fair share of club profits to be directed to veteran support.

Here's why:

- Clubs, including those which use the RSL name, make an annual profit of \$4.8 billion from poker machines. In 2024, just 0.008% of that profit flowed to 'veteran services'.
- One in three veterans does not know the difference between Clubs and sub-Branches. This prevents them accessing the community and the life-saving support of the real RSL.

This will not be an easy argument. But surely we can all agree that we have a responsibility to defend the future of the real RSL, the RSL that stands for veterans and their families.

Finally, I know many of you are working hard in your local communities to stage commemoration services, speak with local schools, and support veterans and their families. RSL NSW members volunteer half a million hours each year to this vital work. Thank you all.
